Best Software for Interviewing Witnesses

VIDEO CONFERENCING TOOLS FOR INTERVIEWS

There are a lot of software options available to law firms for conducting interviews, but most of them are not free and some are expensive. These software programs tend to be geared toward interviewing prospective employees, but they also serve well for interviewing clients and witnesses.

However, deciding about paid software is above your paygrade. The office will make that choice.

If your firm does not subscribe to any of those software packages, no problem. There are several great free (or almost free) video conferencing apps and software tools.

Zoom

This tool has quickly become a powerful player in the video conferencing game. Spend a couple of hours on it as a moderator and you will be able to use it like a pro.

Skype

The advantage of Skype is that so many have already used it. It is less intimidating than most software for video conferencing and is great for one-on-one online meetings. Skype video, audio, and file transfers are encrypted if you are using Skype-to-Skype. But if you call a regular phone number instead of a Skype username the data will not be encrypted.

Google Meet (formerly Google Hangouts)

While you need to subscribe to *Google's G Suite* to use this app, it is not expensive. However, there have been more concerns about security with Google Meet (or at least with its predecessor, Hangouts) than other conferencing apps.
