Citations can be frustrating, but even more so if your career starts out in a remote working environment.

If you are struggling with understanding citation form, fear not. There are solutions.

- First and foremost, use the Study
 Support website. There are a lot of tools there, including:
 - Comments
 - > Interactive Exercises
 - Diagrams

- Re-study Volume 1, Chapter 10 and this chapter. Start from scratch. Trying to learn citation form a second time will make citations more easily understood.
- Go online and search for citation instruction to view other methods of teaching citations. Conduct a Google search, or go to YouTube.com to find videos about citation format.
