Citation Support

Citations can be frustrating, but even more so if your career starts out in a remote working environment.

If you are struggling with understanding citation form, fear not. There are solutions.

- First and foremost, **use the Study Support website**. There are a lot of tools there, including:
 - *Comments*
 - *Interactive Exercises*
 - *Diagrams*
- **Re-study Volume 1, Chapter 10 and this chapter**. Start from scratch. Trying to learn citation form a second time will make citations more easily understood.
- Go online and **search for citation instruction** to view other methods of teaching citations. Conduct a Google search, or go to *YouTube.com* to find videos about citation format.
- Many **law school websites** provide citation information. These are most often references and examples as opposed to instruction, but they can be helpful.
