
## Routes to Judicial Review







## Procedural Questions

#### Standing

- Who may seek judicial review?
- Did the party suffer an actual injury or a threat of an injury?
- Will the injury be redressed by a favorable judicial opinion?
- Are the interests within the rights protected by statute or constitution?

## Procedural Questions

### Ripeness

• Has the controversy reached maturity?

#### **Exhaustion**

- Have all administrative agency procedures been utilized?
- Have all administrative remedies been addressed?

## **Primary Jurisdiction**

- Does the administrative agency have the needed expertise in the field?
- Does the jurisdiction lie within the agency?

## Scope of Review

#### Limitations

- Agency record
- Issues raised
- Reasons for agency decisions

#### Extent

- Relevant questions of law
- Procedures
- Entire Agency Record

#### Law/Fact

Rightness/

#### Correctness

- Substantial Evidence

## Governmental Agencies

The federal government has over 50 large administrative agencies dealing with a wide variety of topics

In addition to agencies embedded in the executive branch of the government, there are "independent" agencies such as the Interstate Commerce Commission

## Governmental Agencies

Many positions that are not called "paralegals," but require a legal background but not a law degree.

Some may use legal terms such as "legal assistant" or "legal specialist," but others will not.

# Governmental Agencies

Many other positions that do not require specific legal knowledge, but do require the analytical and critical thinking, writing, and other skills so integral to the paralegal profession.

Be creative in your job search and be open to positions that will "get you in the door.

## ABA Guidelines

The American Bar Association proposed model guidelines to assist lawyers in utilizing paralegals.

These guidelines address professional conduct, delegation of work, legal opinions, client confidences, and conflict of interest.

The lawyer is responsible for the professional conduct of the paralegal while at the law firm or administrative agency.
